Grade School Building Report:

Grade school teaching staff is gathering data using assessments such as DIBELS, IXL, and Diagnostic. MTSS Intervention data also helps evaluate. Mrs. Keller is evaluating and adding 3 yr. olds to preschool depending on the evaluation results. Looking ahead: The state is asking assessment be completed at the beginning of Kindergarten to check readiness of students in the state instead of at pre-school screenings.

Junior-Senior School Building Report:

QJSHS has wrapped up one of the busiest Septembers since Mr. Countryman has been here. Leanna Wylie was responsible for setting up Scott Huffman as a speaker for a Homecoming activity before the parade. Mr. Huffman was then honored at halftime of the football game for his induction into the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame. Mr. Countryman is still waiting on a bid for the wind turbine repair. A written version of the ACT Test was given at the high school. Mr. Lee promoted it so several students participated in the test. Drug testing policies were tabled to the November meeting. District is lacking \$2,000 in funds, which may be covered if a grant is awarded, to start the auditorium sound system upgrade. Amplifier for announcers outside speaker system is also needing repaired or replaced. Mr. Countryman and Kirsten Lundgren attended the Kansas Education Systems Accreditation (KESA) Zero Year Training. District leadership team will be the PDC committee, but need to put together building leadership teams. Mr. Countryman recommended Daryl Havlas as head JH girls basketball coach and Shelby Gottschalk as the assistant JH girls basketball coach. Golden Plains Credit Union donated \$1,200 to the auditorium sound system from black out t-shirt sales pending board approval. Mr. Countryman has received request to buy art carving knives no longer used and the old non working Dixon lawn mower. Looking Ahead: Evaluations are in progress, basketball season begins for JH students next week, Mr. Countryman will be attending a SPED seminar in Salina and he will begin working on the district calendar for 2017-2018 to submit the BOE in December.

RESOLUTION CHANGING THE METHOD OF ELECTION AND VOTING PLAN OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 293 GOVE COUNTY, KANSAS WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas is presently elected under the Six-Member district method of election and Voting Plan-C, under which method of election and voting plan the unified school district is divided into six member districts, one board member is elected from each member district and one board member is elected at large; and WHEREAS, K.S.A. 72-8001 et seq., provides a procedure by which the voting plan or method of election, or both, within a school district may be changed; and WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable and in the best interest of all of the electors in the Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas, that the voting plan of the district be changed to Voting Plan-A, under which voting plan: All electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law, and who reside in the school district may vote in both the primary and general election for all member positions. WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable and in the best interests of all of the electors in Unified School District No.293, Gove County, Kansas, that the method of election in the district be changed to the at-large method of election under which: ALTERNATIVE D: AT LARGE METHOD The school district is not divided into any member districts and all board members are elected at large. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 293, GOVE COUNTY, KANSAS, as follows: Section 1. The voting plan for Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas is changed from Voting Plan-C to Voting Plan-A, as provided by K.S.A. 72-8003(a) or (b) or (c), under which: NOTE: Voting Plan-A: All electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law, and who reside in the school district may vote in both the primary and general election for all member positions. Section 2. The method of election in Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas, is changed from the SIX-MEMBER DISTRICTS method of election to the AT LARGE method of election, under which: NOTE: ALTERNATIVE D: AT LARGE METHOD The school district is not divided into any member districts and all board members are elected at large. Section 3. A plan of change setting forth in detail, the present method of election and voting plan and the proposed changes in the voting plan and method of election have been prepared and are now on file in the office of the clerk of the board. Section 4. The proposed change will be made only after the plan of change is first approved by a majority of the electors in the school district voting on the question at an election at which such question is submitted to the electors of Unified School District No. 293, as provided in K.S.A. 72-8007. ADOPTED by the Quinter School District of Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas, the 10 day of October, 2016. Motion by Polifka/Herl (m/s/c 6-0)
