Junior-Senior Building Report:

Shelby Coburn and Joshua Caasi presented the Senior class trip itinerary and asked for an additional two days and use of three school suburban's. Three engineers have been in to evaluate the HS heating upgrade. Equipment is working well but there may be a design issue. HS staff is reviewing Aspire test data looking for trends to help students and drive curriculum. ACT will be given at QHS in September. All Seniors will take a Work Keys test on March 25th and cost of the test will be paid by a grant through Hansen Foundation. E-Rate for technology upgrades has been submitted. Mr. Countryman will be meeting with Nex-Tech for wireless security options to lock down the school. Mr. Countryman has received a request to begin a Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) club at the HS. USD 293's Crisis Plan was sent to Board members electronically to review and Mr. Countryman asked for it to be approved. A drill on crisis training in conjunction with Quinter City staff will be held with HS students in the future. Two interviews have been set up for the Ag position and one more to be scheduled. Mr. Countryman will attend a career interview day at ESU. Q-Club would like to use suburban's to go on a trip over spring break. Ashley Miller has made it to State Poetry Out Loud and Brice Hackler will compete for the third year at State Piano. Mr. Countryman is finishing scheduled teacher evaluations.

Information Report

Board of Education took a five minute break at 8:27 PM.

Superintendent's Report:

Senate Bill-71 still to be voted on would result in Quinter receiving a reduction this budget year of \$46,983. Governor's Allotment will reduce public schools by 1.5% from BSAPP on March 7th which means \$20,713 for Quinter Schools. Mrs. Zeigler has implemented immediate need purchases only, recommended only making the current wind turbine payment instead of paying it off this year, and moving maintenance salaries to Capital Outlay to off set the Governor's Allotment reduction. KASB recommends school Boards who do not agree with moving school Board elections to adopt a resolution. Mrs. Zeigler attended the superintendents' meeting at NKESC and other districts have cut or are looking at cutting school nurse, band, library, art, going to bigger class sizes of 25-30 students in the GS level, and buying out older teachers. Mrs. Zeigler recommends that the Board review the Ag program and consider cutting the program based on the depth of future budget cuts. Robert Herl, Dave Polifka and Mrs. Zeigler reviewed the KASB Negotiation meetings they attended. Mrs. Zeigler reviewed a proposal from the Kansas Professional Negotiations Act for changes that state's major education organizations hope will be initiated for next year.

QUINTER SCHOOL DISTRICT, UNIFIED SCHOOL DISRICT NO. 293 BOARD RESOLUTION 2015 Kansas State Legislative Actions Relating to School Board Elections. A RESOLUTION by the Board of Education of the Quinter Public Schools, Unified School District No. 293, Gove County, Kansas, regarding the Kansas State Legislature's proposed bills to alter the process for electing public board of education members in Kansas. WHEREAS, the Founding Fathers of the State of Kansas provided in Article 6 of the State's Constitution for the establishment and maintenance of public schools; and WHEREAS, the people of Kansas approved by popular vote an amendment in 1966 endowing locally elected boards of education with the sole responsibility of maintaining, developing and operating local public schools; and WHEREAS, all children in Kansas deserve access to a public education absent of potentially divisive partisanship; and WHEREAS, moving local public school board elections to November of even-numbered years would reduce focus on school board candidates as they compete for attention with all other candidates for every federal, state and local office; and WHEREAS, moving school board elections from the spring to fall would impair a school district's efficient operation based on a fiscal year of July 1 to June 30; and WHEREAS, moving school board elections from the spring to fall would potentially create a "lame duck" board, thereby impeding discussions of administrator evaluations, contract extensions, teacher evaluations, teacher negotiations and budget preparation; and WHEREAS, partisan elections would bar federal executive branch and military employees from running for office and serving their communities by holding local office; and WHEREAS, current options in voting plans allow local districts to determine the best plan to ensure representation from all parts of the district; and WHEREAS, the current election cycle for electing local public education board members has and will continue to serve the children of Kansas well, as demonstrated by the fact that Kansas ranks among the top states in educational outcome for successful students while spending below the national average per pupil; and WHEREAS, increasing voter participation can be accomplished without disrupting the current election cycle. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we as a Locally-Elected Board of Education call upon the Kansas State Legislature to pass no law changing the election cycle for local boards of education; and FURTHERMORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we as a Locally-Elected Board of Education call up0on the Kansas State Legislature to pass no law changing the nonpartisan status of local board of education elections. Calendar committee has met and submitted two drafts for the Board of Education to adopt. The only difference between the two drafts is the day off in November. Draft I has November 9th off, and draft II has November 30th off. Staff voted for draft II. NKESC buy-in services were reviewed for 2015-2016 school year. Board of Education recommended checking into the Gifted services to assess the needs for those services and report to the Board at the March meeting. Aaron Betz, Mr. Countryman, and Mrs. Zeigler reviewed topics discussed at the Education Commissioner's meeting they attended in Oakley. Giovani Caasi notified the Board that Dr. Mills has resigned from NW-Tech effective in the fall. NW-Tech's annual Endowment Auction on March 7, 2015.
